### Realizing Indonesia's True Potential by Boosting and Safeguarding Infrastructure Development

- As the region's largest archipelago, Indonesia encompasses more than 17,500 islands which span almost 5000 km, yet many of these islands remain unconnected. This has prevented the country to realize its true potential, one of which is to become the region's maritime axis
- The government has set its plan and strategy, and implementation is underway. Ensuring that the strategy is well executed is key and requires ongoing commitment from all stakeholders
- KADIN, as the prominent business community in the country, is ready to take the strategic role as a catalyst. It will, with the support from all parties, work hand-in-hand with the government to prioritize immediate sectors and build a conducive ecosystem

**Jakarta, 02 November 2015** – According to the National Planning Agency (Bappenas), in the next five years, the government will roll out construction of 1,000 km of toll roads, 2,650 km of new roads and undertake road maintenance of 46,770 km. The government will also build 15 new airports, procure 20 pioneer aircraft, and will refine air cargo services at a number of airport locations. In addition, the government will build a railway line spanning to 3,258 km in Java, Sumatra, Sulawesi and Kalimantan. The railway line includes intercity trains along 2,159 km and 1,099 km of urban railway. That does not include construction of 24 new ports, the procurement of 26 freighter pilots, the development of ferry ports in 60 locations and the procurement of 50 units of ferry pilot.

This massive development plan will need profound ongoing support from all stakeholders, public and private sectors alike. "The Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KADIN), as a key business community in the country, fully supports the Jokowi-JK government in injecting more than USD 5 billion to Stated Owned Enterprises, to be utilized in handling national critical infrastructure projects," Suryo Bambang Sulisto, Chairman of KADIN said. "We encourage all stakeholders to be fully committed to undertake infrastructure development. KADIN is ready to become the hub and motor to ensure that collaborations between stakeholders go smoothly, challenges addressed, and solutions achieved" added Sulisto.

#### The region's maritime axis

Based on the United Nations Convention of Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), Indonesia has 5.8 million square kilometers of waters, much wider than its land which is only 1.9 million square kilometers. There is a considerable untapped potential for Indonesia to become the region's maritime axis, a role that has on to the neighbouring country, Singapore, for the



last few decades. President Joko Widodo has in separate occasions, stated his vision to transform the country into a regional hub of maritime trade and commerce and restore the country's maritime infrastructure.

The inter-island connectivity is expected to enable effective use of island resources while also preventing external poaching of maritime resources. Port and infrastructure development will increase the country's growth, provide jobs for citizens, distribute wealth equally among the country's developed west and underdeveloped east and guard the country's maritime security.

However, it is a real challenge ahead. If infrastructure development is done improperly, the country risks its large amount of tax payers' Rupiah and private sector investment. "This is something that we definitely want to avoid. The vision is there, the strategy is also there, the missing piece of the puzzle is how to ensure that the plan comes to fruition," Sulisto said. "KADIN is supporting the government to prioritize key sectors of infrastructure development while also providing input based on real challenges happening in the field. We have received insights from our branches spread all over the provinces, about policy challenges, inadequate human resources, and the technology-gap that have been identified as key issues," he continued.

KADIN is one of the key hosts in this year's Indonesia Infrastructure Week, organizing the Indonesia International Infrastructure Conference and Exhibition' 15 (IIICE), on 4-6 November 2015 at Jakarta Convention Centre, where key government players, private sectors and related stakeholders will come together and share the latest update and insights on infrastructure development plans. The event will serve as a forum where information from the field will shared transparently and stimulate debate to find the most effective solutions. Also in the event, KADIN will host a Regional Government Conference (RGC' 15), where regional government leaders and officials will exchange information and best practices of infrastructure programs.
